The Clean Coal Power Initiative (CCPI) is a government/industry partnership to implement the President’s National Energy Policy recommendation to increase investment in clean coal technology. This recommendation, one of several dealing with electricity, addresses our National challenge of ensuring the reliability of our electric supply while simultaneously protecting our environment. This ten-year initiative will be tentatively funded at a total Federal cost share estimated at \$2 billion with a matching cost share of at least 50%. The CCPI Round 1 Solicitation represents the first installment of Federal funding for the CCPI Program. Total government funding for this round is expected to be around \$300-\$400 million.

The CCPI Round 1 Solicitation is seeking projects that: (1) demonstrate advanced coal-based technologies; and (2) accelerate their deployment to commercial use. The solicitation is open to any technology advancement related to coal-based power generation that results in efficiency, environmental and economic improvement compared to currently available state-of-the-art alternatives. The solicitation is also open to technologies capable of producing any combination of heat, fuels, chemicals or other useful byproducts in conjunction with power generation.

This “Draft Solicitation Meeting & Web Cast” is being held to solicit comments and questions regarding a draft solicitation document to be released at the end of December. Prospective stakeholders are cordially invited to participate at the NETL meeting or by web cast per the web cast instructions provided below. This meeting will assist the DOE in designing a solicitation that best satisfies the needs of prospective participants, stakeholders and the American public.
