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
Operational overview

- W.Va. Clean State Program housed in the W.Va. Division of Energy
- Recently added a co-coordinator, focus on southern half of state
- Current stakeholders: 38
- Prospective stakeholders invited through letter from co-coordinators

Biodiesel still a focus



- 40 out of 55 county school systems use biodiesel blends in their buses, up from 31 in spring 2009 (map shows 35; it gets updated at annual survey time)
- Program distributes biodiesel stickers to school transportation directors, a visible reminder to state residents sharing the roads with cleaner, greener school buses

Hydrogen station moving to Morgantown



- Station currently at Yeager Airport in Charleston
- To be moved to Morgantown
- Still part of W.Va. Clean State Program
