Four Local High School Teams Emerge Victorious as Regional Science Bowl Finalists
Winner of Final Matches Will Compete at National Science Bowl® in DC

Following the preliminary rounds of competition held today at the Community College of Allegheny County South Campus (CCAC), four regional high school teams emerged from a field of 48 scholastic team entries to qualify for the championship rounds of the Southwestern Pennsylvania Science Bowl scheduled for Wednesday, March 4, at the U.S. Department of Energy's (DOE) National Energy Technology Laboratory (NETL) in South Park Township.

The winning teams that will compete in the championship rounds are Canon-McMillan team 1, North Allegheny Intermediate team 1, North Allegheny Senior team 1, and Pittsburgh Allderdice team 1. All four finalist schools receive funds for their school science programs ranging from \$500 to \$1,250 as well as local trips and other prizes. The finalist team that goes on to win the regional championship will receive an expense-paid trip to Washington, D.C., to compete in DOE's National Science Bowl® set for April 30 to May 4.

Runner-up teams in today's competitions were Bethel Park team 1, Greensburg Central Catholic team 2, Mount Lebanon team 1, and Mount Lebanon team 2.

Eight teams were also selected to receive Civility Awards for sportsmanship for their respective divisions. They are Baldwin team 2, Bethel Park team 2, East Allegheny team 2, North Hills team 2, Norwin team 2, Plum team 1, South Fayette team 2, and Thomas Jefferson team 1.
