Authorized by the **Bipartisan Infrastructure Law** and administered through the Grid Deployment Office, the Grid Resilience State and Tribal Formula Grants program is designed to strengthen and modernize America's power grid against wildfires, extreme weather, and other natural disasters that are exacerbated by the climate crisis.

The program will distribute funding to States, Territories, and federally recognized Indian Tribes, including Alaska Native Regional Corporations and Alaska Native Village Corporations, over five years based on a formula that includes factors such as population size, land area, probability and severity of disruptive events, and a locality's historical expenditures on mitigation efforts. Priority will be given to projects that generate the greatest community benefit providing clean, affordable, and reliable energy.







- Principal Investigator/Technical Project Manager
- Business Point of Contact





Tribal Consortiums & Third-Party Agents

If your Tribe is interested in joining a tribal consortium

- ▶ Identify the lead Indian Tribe that will apply on behalf of the Tribe. They will need to identify the points of contact.
- Note: Tribal Consortium applications were added in Amendment 7 of the ALRD.

If your Tribe is interested in having a third-party representative

▶ Identify the third-party agent that will represent the Tribe or the tribal consortium.







Grid Resilience State and Tribal Formula Grant: Registration and Pre-Application Requirements

There are several one-time actions that must be completed before submitting an application in response to this ALRD:

- Register with System for Award Management (SAM)
- Obtain a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI)
- Register with FedConnect





System for Award Management (SAM.gov)

Applicants must register with the SAM at https://www.sam.gov prior to submitting an application in response to this ALRD.



- Designating an Electronic Business Point of Contact (EBiz POC) and obtaining a special password called an MPIN are important steps in SAM registration.
- The applicant must maintain an active SAM.gov registration with current information at all times during which they have an active Federal award or an application under consideration.
- It may take up to two weeks to register with SAM.



Unique Entity Identifier (UEI)


- ► Applicants must obtain an UEI from the SAM to uniquely identify the entity. The UEI is available in the SAM entity registration record.
- Obtaining a UEI make take one day after enter the EBiz POC name and email in SAM.
- (The UEI replaces the DUNS number that was previously required for Federal grants)

SECTION 40101(D) FORMULA GRANTS TO STATES & INDIAN TRIBES

Amendment 005 of ALRD DE-FOA-0002736 (BIL – PREVENTING OUTAGES AND ENHANCING THE RESILIENCE OF THE ELECTRIC GRID FORMULA GRANTS TO STATES AND INDIAN TRIBES) was issued on March 20, 2023. The link to ALRD Amendment 005 (FedConnect) is below. Amendment 005 extends the application submittal deadline from March 31, 2023 to May 31, 2023 and adds the option for mailing in hard-copy applications for recipients that have limited or no internet connectivity and are unable to submit via FedConnect (e.g., remote Alaskan Tribes). These and other administrative changes as summarized on pages 2-3 of ALRD Amendment 005.

Under Section 40101(d) Formula Grant Program of the <u>Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL)</u>, the Department of Energy will provide grants to States (including U.S. Territories) and Indian Tribes to improve the resilience of their electric grids. States and Indian Tribes may further allocate funds to "eligible entities", as defined by Section 40101(d). These grants offer a unique opportunity to advance the capabilities of States and Indian Tribes, and their communities, to address not only current, but future resilience needs. The requirements of this formula grant program are defined within Section 40101(d) of the BIL. Section 40101(d) stipulates that DOE allocate funding annually through grants to States and Indian Tribes according to a formula that includes such parameters as population, land area, and the historical precedence for experiencing disruptive events. The resulting formula allocation for the first year of the program is provided below. Additionally, the Administrative and Legal Requirements Document (ALRD) and associated documents and links below provide eligible applicants with program and application information and requirements.








Signatures on Forms

- ▶ The signatures on the application forms may be:

 - printed, signed by pen/ink and then scanned.
 - printed, signed by pen/ink and mailed in.
- Acknowledgement of award documents by the Grantee's authorized representative through electronic systems used by the Department of Energy constitutes the Grantee's acceptance of the terms and conditions of the award.
- Acknowledgement via FedConnect by the Grantee's authorized representative constitutes the Grantee's electronic signature.

A description of how the Tribe will ensure their proposal will incorporate: (a) quality jobs, prioritize the greatest community benefits, and (c) share or maximize project benefits across disadvantaged communities.

Technical Assistance & Administration

An explanation for how you plan to use the 5% of funds for TA and project administration

Public Notice & Hearing

A description of public notice and hearing activities, as required by 40101(d)(2)(B)(ii)





Grid Resilience State and Tribal Formula Grant:Forms - Designation Letters

Designation Letter

- Verifies that the applicant is the sole authorized applicant on behalf of the State or Indian Tribe, or Tribal Consortium and has the authority to receive and administer the resulting grant agreement, including providing the required cost match.
 - Head of Government Letter,
 - Tribal Council Resolution,
 - Other instrument of appointment by the Indian Tribe or Alaska Native Corporation's legally authorized entity, consistent with their customs.
- ▶ Template for Designation Letter is available under forms.

Designation letters for Tribal Consortiums

The consortium application package must include the following:

- Letter from **each participating Indian Tribe** designating the lead Indian Tribe to act on its behalf as lead Indian Tribe of the Tribal Consortium and receive their allocations;
- Lead Indian Tribe Letter accepting the designation as the lead for the Consortium. The letter should state that the lead Indian Tribe will apply for grant funding and administer the grant on behalf of all participating consortium Indian Tribes.









Grid Resilience State and Tribal Formula Grant: Forms - SF-424

- ► The SF-424 is the standard application used for all Federal grants and cooperative agreements.
- ► An instruction sheet is provided on the same web page where the form is posted.

- ▶ The Organizational DUNS number is no longer used. "8.c. Organizational DUNS" should include the UEI.
- ▶ If you are using an older version of the SF-424, the SF-424 might not accept the UEI number in the DUNS field (8c). If this happens you may either:
 - Use a more recent version of the form
 - Leave the field blank and include the UEI in the Pre-Award Information Sheet submitted with your application.



- The "a. Federal" funding will be the sum of the Year 1 and Year 2 allocations for your Indian Tribe or all Tribes within a Tribal Consortium.
- Year 1 and Year 2 formula allocations are provided here: <u>Section 40101(d) Formula Grants to States & Indian Tribes | netl.doe.gov</u>
- ► The "b. Applicant" funding will be the 15% cost match on the Federal allocation
- ▶ All other funding fields (c, d, e and f) will be \$0

Note that the required cost match provided by eligible entities performing resilience projects will be captured when you provide the resilience project and subaward notification (post-award)

Environmental Questionnaire

- The NEPA Environmental Questionnaire you submit with your grant application will address only the technical assistance and administrative activities.
 - The initial award will only authorize the technical assistance and administrative activities
 - Resilience projects and associated subawards must be approved individually post-award and will require separate Environmental Questionnaires.
- Technical assistance and administrative activities are "Group A" activities.
- For the initial grant application, once you complete Section II Questionnaire, you may check the Group A box, then proceed directly to Section III Certification by Proposer and sign the form.



SF-LLL (Disclosure of Lobbying Activities)

- Applicants may not use any federal funds to influence or attempt to influence, directly or indirectly, congressional action on any legislative or appropriation matters.
- Ensures that non-federal funds have not been paid and will not be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence any of the following in connection with the application:
 - An officer or employee of any federal agency;
 - A Member of Congress;
 - An officer or employee of Congress; or
 - An employee of a Member of Congress.
- If the applicant does not lobby and has no lobbyist, fields in Section 10 may be marked "not applicable"
- ▶ A SF-LLL is required by all Tribes in a Tribal Consortium.

Cost Match Requirements

When must the cost match be provided?

- ▶ States, Tribes and Territories must agree that they will provide cost match, as part of the terms of the grant agreement.
- However, cost match does not need to be provided up front.
- Cost match should be provided/disbursed as federal funds are expended during the course of project execution and drawdown of federal funds. States, Indian Tribes, and subrecipients may utilize in-kind contributions to meet cost match requirements, where applicable.





Cost Match Commitment Letter(s)

Only required if another entity is committed to funding the applicants cost match.

- Tribes participating in a consortium that will provide cost match should submit a cost match commitment letter.
- ► The letter should state which party is committed to providing a specific minimum dollar amount of cost match.
- Identifies the type of proposed cost match (e.g., cash, services, and/or property) to be contributed
- Signed by the person authorized to commit the expenditure of funds by the entity.
- ► The applicant should submit the letter(s) in PDF format. Save this information in a single file named "CMCL.pdf"

After Submission



- NETL will reach out to applicants if there are errors or missing information in the submission
- ► Grant recipients may, at any time <u>after they receive the grant</u>, provide notification and documentation to DOE for resilience projects and subawards. This process is described in **ALRD Section V.G Resilience Project and Subaward/Subcontract Notification**.
 - Be aware that review of the documentation and required written concurrence by DOE may take considerable time and will be impacted by factors such as National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) considerations. Please allow sufficient time for this process from when you provide the required information to DOE.
